10/12/23 Week 42: Rescue LIFE James and Betty Robison Dr. Robert Jeffress #2

In the studio

JAMES: I want to welcome you to *Life Today*. We have not only one of the most popular guests we ever have on *Life Today*, but he is the most popular guest on nearly every network or television program he gets on. And he is really a popular guest at First Baptist Church Dallas where they've had some pretty good preachers visit and some pretty good pastors amazingly. Do you know what those that are still around say about him? Never been a First Baptist Church pastor like Robert Jeffress. He can do everything but walk on water. We haven't seen him try that yet. But what he's doing in leadership is amazing.

Now, listen to me, this guy is blessed, his church is blessed, his church is a blessing. I've gone with him all over the country to talk to the most powerful people and leaders on the planet and I watch how he impacts them. I think he would say and I do, James. Now listen. Here's the key. We left these ten incredibly important matters, not suggestions: "How to live and love in a world that has lost its way." That's us. But here's why. It is the Ten Commandments.

Robert Jeffress, Dr. Jeffress, First Baptist Church pastor, thank you for being back on *Life Today*. Do you even remember how many years ago you started being on *Life Today*?

ROBERT: It was at least ten years ago.

JAMES: So it's been a while since you were here. You didn't come from Wichita Falls? Was the drive too far? What was the deal?

ROBERT: It was because you would never have me.

[Laughter]

JAMES: Maybe you were still finding your way. Look to where you found your way to. Let me ask you this. You grew up in the church.

ROBERT: Yeah.

JAMES: Were you shocked that you came back to pastor that church?

ROBERT: Honestly, I wasn't. When I was 15 years old, I was called to the ministry, and I went to see the pastor, Dr. Criswell, who was there for 50 years. And I told him God had called me to be a pastor. He said, "Well, Robert, this is what I want you to do." Now I'm 15. He said, "I want you to spend the summer and I want you to work in the missions' area, the children's area, the music area. I want you to get to know every square inch of this place."

JAMES: At First Baptist Dallas?

ROBERT: At First Baptist Dallas. "Because I believe this is all going to be yours one day."

JAMES: How old were you?

ROBERT: Fifteen. And so he had me kneel with him and he prayed for me as God led me eventually to become the pastor of the church, and that God would bless me. So I had a hint that that was what was going to happen.

JAMES: Are you loving that place and responsibility right now?

ROBERT: I love First Baptist Church. I've been in two other great churches but there is no

church like First Baptist Dallas because it is a church built not on denomination or tradition, it's built on the Bible. 155 years in downtown Dallas standing strong for the Word of God. So I pastor, I think, the greatest church in the world.

JAMES: Well, they think you're the greatest pastor in the world and we're not going to waste time arguing with them.

I want you to take off here. Just start. We've talked about some that you wanted to spend a little bit of time on. Do you say leaving the first one out just starts the whole thing going the wrong way?

ROBERT: Well, certainly, there is one God—only one God. Most people think that God is whoever they imagine him to be. They don't worship idols. They don't have a little statue that they bow down to. So some Christians think well, I'm not guilty of idolatry. Well, idolatry is loving anything or anyone more than you love God. And a lot of people have a false idea of who God is. They think God is a sum of my speculations about him.

I remember our mutual friend, David Jeremiah talked about a lady who came up to him after a sermon and said, "Dr. Jeremiah, I just want you to know that the god I serve would never send somebody to hell for not believing in Jesus."

And David said, "I'm sure he wouldn't because the god you serve doesn't exist. He is the god of your imagination."

So when we talk about God, we need to be sure we're worshipping the true God and that's really what the first two commandments deal with.

JAMES: You said you wanted to talk about the value of God's day. Now we have ten here. Here we are, God's day.

ROBERT: If there is one thing I could say about this book, *The Ten*, it is *The Ten* reminds us

that God gave his laws not to restrict our freedom but to enhance it, to enhance our joy. I tell people, I use this illustration. When our daughter Julia, and you've had her on your show here, when she was six, we went up to Pikes Peak; and drove up to Pikes Peak. We were taking pictures there. And suddenly, she started running towards the edge. There was no boundary up there, no guardrail or anything. And reflexively I yelled out, "Stop! Stop!" Now why did I do that? Was I trying to steal some wonderful experience from her of falling over a mountain? I did that because I loved her and I saw her going in a direction that was going to bring harm to her.

That's why God says don't do this. Don't do this. Do this instead. He is not some cosmic killjoy who is trying to keep us from anything good. He is trying to prevent bad things from coming into our lives. And remembering the Sabbath is a good idea. The Sabbath, God said, Jesus said, was not made for God. God made it for our benefit. God knows there's one day a week that we need to take off, to refresh, and to reflect on him. It's not about rules.

I always got tickled about people who would say, "Well, we Baptists say you can't go to the movies on Sunday. That's what keeping the Sabbath means. Don't go to the movies." My grandparents were Methodist and I couldn't believe that they went to the movie on Sunday afternoons. I thought they were going to hell. But I secretly thought I'd sure like to be a Methodist.

But it is not about restrictions like that. It's saying God made us. He knows we need one day a week when we cease working and refresh ourselves physically, emotionally, and spiritually.

JAMES: This one we see totally, basically disobey him, and then we look and it looks like we can almost see the reason that it might be a fact: Honor your parents. We don't see much of that going on. But then if we look a little deeper, sometimes, we think how would you honor those parents? They don't honor God. They don't honor anything. In other words, tell us why that is such a big deal.

ROBERT: You know that's interesting. That is the only commandment that has a promise attached to it. And God said to the Israelites, "So that your days may be long in the land in which

you dwell." Well, he was talking about a national blessing that comes from honoring parents. And here's why. If you teach your children to honor and obey you when they're children, they will learn respect for other authority figures that come into their lives whether it is an employer, a school teacher, law enforcement, or the government. But if they learn they can disobey their parents then they will disobey anyone.

For a child obeying your parents means honoring, it means to obey them. As young adults when you start your own home, you're not under the authority of your parents but it is wise to consult them, to seek their advice.

But people say, how do I do it if my parents are dead? Well, you honor them in how you speak about them. Let's be honest. There are bad things we can choose to remember about our parents. They made mistakes just like we do. But to honor them means to speak well of them. It is not that you approve of everything they did but speak well of them for the good things that they did. We have a mutual friend—

JAMES: Probably a lot of them.

ROBERT: June Hunt. June's in our church; she was my youth director growing up when I was listening to you at the age of 13. But June Hunt tells in her testimony that her dad made some big mistakes and there were some things that were not right there. But she also honors her dad for the good qualities like hard work and other things he instilled in her. And I think that's what it means for us to honor; to choose to remember the good, speak about the good, and forgive the bad.

JAMES: You know, if you start by not honoring them, you're going to dishonor a lot of things that need to be honored, including God. Really and truly, it all stacks up real fast. Let's get this one: Preserve life. Don't murder.

ROBERT: Don't murder. Some people use the King James version, "Thou shalt not kill." But that doesn't capture it because there is some killing that is sanctified by God. Just wars, capital

punishment: that was God's idea. Defending yourself against an intruder. The law spells out you can do that. But murder better captures the idea of premeditated taking of another life out of anger, we're not to do it. By the way, that includes suicide and taking your own life. You have no right to do that. That's God's property. Abortion. Euthanasia.

By the way, you don't have to do just those things to commit murder. You can kill people in other ways. When you destroy their reputation. And we see that so much in Christian circles; just slandering other people without any thought. What you're saying is you deserve to have your reputation slandered and I'm the judge, jury, and executioner. You're not to do that, the Bible says.

JAMES: You've got, Betty, anything just popped into your mind? One of the commandments that you wonder how he kind of expresses or deals with it or helps us understand why that is so important right now?

BETTY: Well, of course, I relate to preserving life. That means so much to me because life is so precious. It is so precious. We had our oldest daughter and then we were told that I wouldn't probably have any more children. So we adopted our son when he was four days old. And then three years later, unbeknownst to us, God gave us Robin. And the preciousness of life. We watched her take her last breath at 40 from cancer. But what precious 40 years that was. And I don't care how young or how old, life is so precious. Precious to God. He made us. He made us and gave us a purpose in life. So that purpose –

And just knowing that through prayer, too, praying to him is so powerful. And now, it seems like that's been taken away. We talked about that a little bit on the other show. It is just like I see our world now where they don't think parents are capable of taking care of their children. The government wants to take them and use them and destroy the parents basically. He wants to take them and rob them of their children. And that's the preciousness of life. There are so many areas of that that we need to look at.

ROBERT: You all demonstrate that, Betty, in so many ways in this ministry about the value of

life. It is not just life in the womb. Some people just want to focus on that. That's important, that's where it begins; but it is life outside of the womb. What you're doing, and helping rescue girls from human trafficking, that's all based on the value of life. Each of those girls has a life that is important to God, that was created by God. Giving people water, these water wells, that's demonstrating the preciousness of life.

JAMES: We'll never stop abortion no matter how many laws you pass if you don't—the mother who has an unwanted child, if she doesn't realize how precious that life is and the potential in that life, you won't stop her from taking that life.

We have to see life as precious with indescribable potential. Who would have ever thought that this product of rape could actually bless so many people? My life had potential. My mother didn't want to get pregnant by an alcoholic when she was 40. But look what God can do. The preciousness of life. Please see that. And this is so clear. You wanted to talk about coveting.

ROBERT: You know the last commandment is "Thou shall not covet. I read that and I thought to myself, if I were God, I would have arranged them differently. I would have ended with a big one. You know, adultery! Murder! Theft! Thou shalt not! Thou shalt not covet? That seems a little weak. But I think there is a reason. I think it is a climax. Coveting is the basis for every other sin that is prohibited in the Ten Commandments. Why do we murder? Why do we commit adultery? Why do we steal? Why do we do these things? Because we're dissatisfied with what God has given us.

JAMES: We're wanting something somebody else has got.

ROBERT: We want something or someone somebody else has. That was the basis for the first sin in heaven. Lucifer didn't like his position. He wants somebody better, different—

JAMES: He wants his position.

ROBERT: And so I think that's the reason for the last commandment. What's the answer to

covetousness? It is contentment. Paul said, "I've learned to be content." That word means containment; to be inwardly satisfied. And for a Christian, that satisfaction is through Jesus Christ. Remember that God's given us everything we need to have a happy and joyful life.

JAMES: You know, God told the Israelites when he led them out of the Egyptian bondage, it was horrible and indescribable. He said I'm going to lead you into a land that flows with milk and honey. It's going to be more fertile, and more productive, and it is going to be more magnificent and more beautiful than you could ever imagine! So you need to be very careful. You need to guard your heart so that you do not let your attraction to something I made to bless you become something that you covet or desire to the point that you make an idol out of it. That attraction becomes a distraction and then it becomes something that holds you captive. And when it holds you captive, then you've lost the very joy and freedom from which I just brought you into the Promised Land blessed beyond description.

The beautiful things God has made, the things that taste good, require some kind of supernatural moderation and self-control. Everything you're attracted to that takes you away from God, that attraction becomes too often an idol that takes away all the joy, blessing, and benefits that God wanted you to have. Everything I made is so magnificently beautiful, that you could desire it, literally, in an idolatrous way. And that is what's happening.

What a powerful book! What a great God to give us these simple directions to have a blessed life that blesses others and you'll find no greater blessing than blessing others, which is what he even found through what his Son went through to bless the whole world with life.

ROBERT: That's right. And if there is one thought that I'd leave with our audience today it's this, this book, the Ten Commandments is not a list of requirements to get into heaven. We can't keep them well enough to get into heaven. God gave these commandments not for his benefit but for our benefit, to enhance our happiness. And when you understand what these commandments mean and how they touch every area of life, you experience eternal life now. "I've come that you might have life and have it more abundantly."

JAMES: I have everlasting life. I have everlasting life now! It started here. And I'm enjoying it. Can you tell I've got some enthusiasm at 80?

ROBERT: And you're not supposed to have a voice right now.

JAMES: Well, I know. Listen, but let me tell you something. I love sports. This girl is a sports fan. I'm going to tell you something. She is a Cowboy fan. I don't know how she can. And she cheers for the Rangers. I don't know how. And the Mavericks.

Here's the deal. I'm a fan too but I'm going to tell you something. I've never been so excited in my life as I am about seeing his vision fulfilled through his family. I'm so excited at 80. I asked the friend who helped me move in here, Dudley Hall, the other day at lunch. I said, "Dudley, you've known me for 50 years. Okay, you've ministered to me when I had the greatest experience of deliverance in the Lord." And I said, "Dudley, let me ask you something. Have you ever seen me more excited or have more joy in my life? Tell me the truth!"

"Never in 50 years!"

I have more joy. I have more peace. I have more excitement. I have more direction. I'm touching more lives now than I ever have, and they're going out and touching more lives than you could ever imagine. Imagine me having an impact on somebody because I'm so excited about the Father's desire and the Father's dream. Do you think at 80 I've gone wacky?

ROBERT: No, I think as we said off camera, you're just getting going now. Moses' second act in life started when he was 80!

JAMES: I didn't know he was 80!

ROBERT: Yeah, he was 80.

JAMES: Are there any predictions about the rest of this ministry? He tells me it is going to be

unbelievable. You got any little advice you can give me?

ROBERT: Just don't hit that rock like he did and you'll be okay.

JAMES: No, sir. I'm going to do it exactly how he says to do it. Folks, it is in the bookstores. You loved this guy before I introduced him. So many people do it's unbelievable. Please get the book.

But I tell you what. You help us put God's arms around girls, and many times boys who are being trafficked sexually, we'll send it to you to say thanks. By the way, because of what we've done with that border, do you realize that insanity is reigning in a lot of places of leadership because these weren't important to them? Would you help us rescue—and by the way, we're working really hard to rescue them here. But would you help us set sexually trafficked girls in the sex capital of the world? And we're there, and in all the other countries, in Asia and other places, rescuing kids that are taken into sexual trafficking.

I want you to listen to one of our partners. He's in Asia. Listen to what he says because you make these great things happen—God's love through you. Thank you for not turning away. Look at the real need and meet that need with his love. Watch!

Don: We couldn't imagine the extent of the evil that allowed four-year olds to be trafficked and

sexually abused by men coming from all over the world. We knew we needed to do more.

One day our phone rang, and it was a young girl trapped in a brothel calling for us to help. So we gave the information to this other organization, but we had to wait three days for them to get into position to do a raid. But it was tipped off and none of the girls were rescued. And now they were moved to a new brothel and we didn't know where they were or how to get them out.

We would never let this happen again. So we partnered with the government and started our own SWAT team. Everything turned around. Instead of raids being tipped off, there was hardly ever a raid that wasn't successful. And now that girl that made the phone call, she is not only rescued, she's not only healed but today she is a social worker of our SWAT team. And when a rescue happens, the first person those girls see is her. She's also testified against a brothel owner. All the girls were rescued, the brothel was shut down, and no girls were being hurt there again.

So much incredible work has been done through the power of Christ but there is still so much more to do. There are girls trapped in brothels. We know where they are and we know how to get them out but we can't do it alone. We need your help. Together we can defeat the greatest evil of our lifetime.

BETTY: We have. We have.

JAMES: Our heart breaks for the men and the people that would use those girls, not only sell them but go and buy them. It breaks my heart. God set us free.

BETTY: James, sometimes it might be just one girl at a time. That one child is worth all that we can give to help rescue them. They got a phone call from one little girl and they couldn't locate her, they kept moving her around. Finally, she was set free. Can you imagine what that day would be like for these children? To know that they've been captive for so long and then they're set free? How wonderful! We know in our own hearts when we've been captive in our own spirits and God sets us free, what a joyful day that is. Join with us. Let's set these children free.

JAMES: That's every missionary in the world because that's important to secure a future for children all over the world and they know that. But we teach them to sing praises. And we used to show you hundreds of them, even thousands of them singing. And the mission workers told us, you can't show that because they're finding them by capturing their pictures. And they capture them on the street or when they're shopping with somebody. They recognize them and take them back. So you can't show their faces anymore.

But if you could see their faces, the glory of God is all over them. And then we taught them how to make a living and how to share life. I mean this outreach is as pure a work of Jesus and the church as anything on planet earth. Would you right now, we have a \$320,000 matching gift from people who say we care so much about it.
