Week 13: Rescue LIFE

In the studio

**JAMES:** Well, one of our favorite people is with us. And you're our favorite people

because you make happen the greatness of God that many people witness on this show.

And the man that's with us certainly witnessed it, and he is a part of it. Because he's been

at my side, you might say in many ways, for more than 40 years. It's Robert Morris, he's

our pastor. He's not only one of the most famous preachers we have on here but he is one

of the most effective preachers we have on here. And his effectiveness is just now

reaching, in my opinion, a level higher than anything he has ever done or written.

Gateway is known as a great church with great campuses and a great impact all over the

world and a great viewing audience. We just introduced the book yesterday, *Dream to* 

Destiny which is phenomenal. Now he's got a book on grace that we want to talk about

today.

I'm going to be giving you a book I want you to read immediately. We put it into action

because if we do, we will save the future of freedom. And we will see all that made this

nation great, and our founders great, and every great thing that's ever happened in history,

and must be in place is taught in 19 short chapters that a seventh grader and up can read

easily—easily! I want you to get it.

Betty and I are here every day. Why are we here every day, Betty?

**BETTY:** Because we love God and we love people—and that's you!

**JAMES:** We love God and our neighbors. And we are here for you. And you know

what? You decide to love God and people all over the world who are not even your neighbors but he died for them. And you decided to help live for them and point them to life.

Well, that's what Robert does. It's non-stop with him. And now Robert, I want to tell you, it is a joy to be your friend. It is a joy to be your co-laborer. It is a joy to be what you call an apostolic elder at the church, a leader. It's been a joy to share at the church. It's been a joy to walk at your side in things that we enjoy. But primarily, getting God's arms around people, getting them to be full of him so that his life and his love flow like a river through them. And it makes an impact; everywhere it flows it brings forth fruit.

Now then, we're realizing it all happens because of His grace. You and I were laughing a little bit before the show but it wasn't too funny. They said for me and you, we knew we needed grace. Debbie, his wife, and Betty, my wife, had a little trouble knowing they needed grace. And Betty will probably tell you today, that she figured it out.

But listen, God's grace is offered and you can't live a life of meaning without experiencing it and expressing it. Robert, cut to the chase. What do you want people to hear about grace?

**ROBERT:** Well, the full title of the book as you can see there is *Grace*, *Period*. I wrote the word *period* out. And the reason is, it's *Grace*, *Period*. That saves us. It is not grace and—it is not grace if—it is not grace but—it is *Grace*, *Period*. And we have added so much to grace. The problem with that is that it confuses us. Instead of doing good works because we're saved, we try to do good works to get God's approval which we already have.

**JAMES:** Even to get saved. Some people think that's going to get them saved.

**ROBERT:** That's exactly right. But we already have it. And so it's completely, totally His grace. And what I've seen in my life and my pastorate is when people finally catch it,

that I'm saved by grace and grace alone, that's when their life is completely changed. Because if you don't understand grace, it changes the way you relate to God, it changes the way you relate to each other, and it changes the way you relate or see yourself. So it changes everything.

**JAMES:** I would think it would relate greatly to how you treat others. Because forgiveness is a real display and expression of grace.

**ROBERT:** It says "Freely you've received, freely you give." So if I don't feel like I've received grace or forgiveness freely, if I feel like I had to earn forgiveness from God then when you do something wrong, I'm going to make you earn my forgiveness. See? It just changes everything. And especially in a marriage, that won't work. [Laughing] That's the last place it will work.

So when we understand grace that is completely and totally what Christ did on the cross, and I simply receive it, it is as if you were giving me a gift. It's not like I have to be good enough. Let me go out and do something, to mow your yard to get the gift, James. Let's do something for you. Let me wash your car. Well, if I do, then it is not a gift.

**JAMES:** Or find a way to pay you back.

**ROBERT:** That's right! That's right! Then it is earned. But if it is a free gift and I receive it freely, there's a love and appreciation, a gratitude that I walk in then for our friendship. That's the same way with the Lord. So many times we walk into a relationship with him that is not a free relationship. It is not a loving friendship relationship.

**JAMES:** I gave you a lot of opportunities starting when you were a teenager. We have walked so many things out together. And many times we experienced grace in the way we loved each other, the way we helped each other, the way we shared. Now then, as you've become one of our greatest supporters and we were yours, even when you began to start a new church, almost when you were a kid in your first ministry. And he's

inspired people to experience *The Blessed Life* of blessing and not giving to get but giving to bless and giving to give. And you know what? Much of the church world got it—the message got them.

That's what he wants to happen with *Dream to Destiny*. That's what I want to happen with *Fight the Good Fight*, the right fight over the enemy. And now then His grace. When you experience His grace, it will flow freely like a river of life and love, which I express over and over. His life, his love flowing through yielded vessels, channels cleansed by his power. And that river of life produces fruitfulness—bountiful fruitfulness, amazing, miraculous, supernatural eternal fruit everywhere it flows. That's grace.

**ROBERT:** Yeah, that's it. Well, so, if I can just take a few minutes and just go theological.

**JAMES:** I'd love for that to happen.

**ROBERT:** I think that one of my gifts is to take something complicated theologically and make it simple. And so when God made the covenant with Moses, there were two types of treaties in the world at that time. One was called a suzerain vassal. I know it is a big two words. But suzerain means sovereign or supreme. And vassal means servant. So a supreme and a servant. And so a supreme nation would make a covenant with smaller nations. It was basically, we'll protect you if you will be our servants. And this is in the Bible. So that's one type of treaty.

The other treaty that was available during Moses' lifetime, 1500 years before Christ, was a parity treaty, or a pair, p-a-i-r. In other words, like equal. And it would be two equal nations that would say, listen, I've got 50,000 soldiers, you've got 50,000 soldiers. We don't know who would win if we fought but let's make a treaty so that together we have 100,000 soldiers and nobody can come against us. If somebody comes against you, I'll come. If somebody comes against me, you'll come.

And what Hebrews goes in and tells us is that the first treaty had a fault. The fault was they couldn't do it; the people couldn't do it. So he had to do a second treaty. So the first covenant was God saying if you do this then I'll do this. If you'll do this then I'll do this. It was a greater nation, God, a greater king, making a covenant with a lesser nation.

But what he wanted to do was a parity treaty. But he couldn't do it, the Bible says, because he didn't have anyone equal. That's Hebrews exactly. But he makes an example of it with Abraham—just the example. And what's amazing is Abraham thinks God is going to make the covenant with him. But he doesn't. He puts him to sleep. He doesn't need Abraham to make the covenant. He makes the covenant, it says a smoking oven, representing God, who forms all life, and a burning torch, the Son, and they pass through the pieces. So the Father makes the covenant with the Son. And Abraham believed and it was counted to him as righteousness. Righteousness means right standing with God. In other words, sin was taken out of his account and right standing was put in his account.

And Romans then tells us that's the new covenant. That he believed and he received right standing with God.

**JAMES:** Am I right to believe that he was sleeping when all of this was happening? So he sure didn't have anything to do with it. It was grace.

**ROBERT:** He just had to believe and then righteousness was put in his account. So that's what the new covenant is. God the Father, on Calvary, made a covenant with God the Son. And if I believe it, then sin is taken out of my account, righteousness, and right standing with God is put into my account.

In other words, I'd like to even just for a minute say to everyone watching, it is the easiest thing in the world to get saved. It's the easiest thing in the world. God doesn't want anyone to spend eternity without him. So all he did was make it so easy that you just simply believe that Jesus died on the cross for your sins, and rose on the third day, that he is the Savior of the world. That's grace. And you can do that right now. You don't even

have to walk down a church aisle to do it. Now it would be good to become a member of a church but you can simply believe in Jesus right now.

That's the difference between the old covenant and the new covenant. The old covenant you had to keep the law. Here's another way to say it. There were 613 laws actually. There were ten commandments and 613 laws. So let's just say God says to you, James, there is a test. It has 613 questions. If you miss one, if you just miss one you fail. And by the way, you've already missed about 590 of them. I mean, Betty had only missed 30, but you missed a bunch of them. *OR* my Son took the test for you, and he made a perfect score. So you can take his grade or you can try to take the test yourself. That's what grace is.

JAMES: We've been together nearly 42 years, in ministry; he working with me, mostly listening to me preach. And we would hear him very seldom, actually standing up sort of preaching. When Robert would sit in the chair over here as an associate over a Shady Grove Church in Grand Prairie, which is Irving, the other side, almost to Dallas, he would come here and start telling us what God was showing him. Sitting here telling us things that he'd see in the Bible. It was just captivating. It was there that we first heard you preach, so to speak.

Now then, we were one of the earlier members at the church we encouraged him to consider being in Southlake, the place that was exploding with people. In over 20 years he did that, and we were one of the first members. Does he not from the pulpit make everything just as clear as he did when he was sitting there? And have you ever heard anybody teach truth in God's word and important matters any more simply and clearly than Robert does?

**BETTY:** No, it's beautiful just listening to you talk about God's grace. Because I'm one of those people that experienced that. Good girl, went to church, never missed anything going on at church. But I had something missing in my life. And God put this man in my life, this young boy, and I got to observe God coming in and changing his heart. I saw

truth and love and God's grace big as life change his life. I thought, I don't have that. I want that but I don't have it.

And so I began to let God change my heart. And when I fell on my knees at church that day, we've talked about it many times, Robert, when we get together, I relive that moment in my life when I said, "I'm tired of being good. I'm tired of working, trying to please God, and trying to be good enough that he will accept me. He says he sent his son Jesus to die for my sin. And Jesus, I give you my life." And it's never been the same. I know what His grace feels like.

**JAMES:** He's beautiful in her, isn't he?

**ROBERT:** He is, he is. And as you mentioned, Debbie and Betty are a lot alike. When the four of us go out to eat, you and I can hardly get a word in edgewise because of those two. That's obviously a joke. Sometimes they scoot their chairs over so they can talk.

But Debbie, almost the same way, when she saw me get saved, she saw, like you, such gratitude. Betty saw that in you. And Debbie used to think, I'll never love Jesus as much as Robert does because he was forgiven so much. And there was even that parable that she misunderstood about the one who has been given much loves much. But it's because the one that's been forgiven little doesn't understand, Jesus said, he's been forgiven just as much. We've all been forgiven—us all.

And Debbie, one day in worship, had this vision that she was in this white wedding dress. She was going to meet Jesus, her groom and she fell in a mud puddle. And she was covered with mud. Even her hair, her skin, where you couldn't just—covered! And she was so brokenhearted. Her dress would never be the same, her hair would never be the same. And then she saw two feet in front of her standing on top of the mud with prints in them. So he wasn't touched by the mud, he was pure. But he reached out his hand. And when she put her hand in his, the mud just went away. And he picked her up and they began to dance.

But she said, "While I was in the mud," she said, "I remembered these things, these sins I'd done growing up." Then she knew she was forgiven; that she was just as sinful or just as muddy as anyone else. But I remember thinking, wait, wait, wait! What sins did you do growing up? I didn't know she had ever sinned. I wanted to know.

You know what she told me? She said, "Well, when we were young, if you tore your notebook paper, we used to have those little white ring circles that you would put on a tear so it would produce the hole again for notebook paper." She asked her mother, they had like a 100 in a package to buy them, because she had one hole in one of her papers. And her mother said no. And so, when her mother wasn't looking, she opened it up and she took one out.

But here's what I remember thinking. You know how my life was. I thought, that's the worst thing you ever did? [Laughing] But the point is, she understood that it wasn't her works, just like Betty. She understood it wasn't that she had to be good enough. That's why I wrote the book. I want people to understand, you don't have to be good enough. You just have to receive what Jesus did for you on the cross.

So I explain it in scripture after scripture after scripture, after illustration after illustration. And I wrote it just like you wrote the book *Fight the Good Fight*, in eight to ten-page chapters. So you could read just one maybe before you went to sleep at night, and just get another truth, another truth, another truth.

**JAMES:** If you read the book, you will find that you're getting in the word but something even more profound and powerful and meaningful, the word will be getting in you—His Word. That's the way Robert preaches; that's the way he writes. I pray you get both of the books that have just come out. This one on grace will introduce you clearly and very well to the power of grace and give you an understanding of what it is.

Betty, you're such a blessing. Thank you for loving Betty like you so obviously do, and

me and our family, and our ministry team, and the missionaries all over the world. Would you right now do what you tell us you love doing as much as anything in the world? And that's caring for the unnoticed and the overlooked, and the trampled and the hurt. These are the sexually enslaved and trafficked by the power of sin. Not theirs, they're the slaves to people who are slaves of sexual sin, and sexual traffic. And we can set them free. And when I say "we," Betty and I can find them, we can pray for them, we can weep over them, we ask God to give us the support for the mission workers and relief workers and the facilities needed. And we ask you to provide it.

I want you to watch this and then I want you to pray about giving \$128 to rescue one, or let's just say \$1280 to rescue ten. But now it is going to be doubled because some people like you gave a \$320,000 matching gift, which will double what you give. Watch closely. Watch very prayerfully and then respond.

**JOHN:** So I'm here and I just walked the last 23 steps between these two countries that a child would take before they stepped off the cliff into a literal hell. I'm so mindful right now of the trickery of the devil, how deceitful he is, and how much he lies to people to lure them into his pit.

And friends, I can promise you, right across that border is the pit that young people never come home from. For children who have been lured, who have been made promises that they're going to have a better life, that they're going to get a job, that someone is going to marry them, that someone is going to love them, and they're all lies.

Standing here I realized how grateful—how grateful I am that we have partners on both sides of this border to help prevent, and to help rescue, and to help restore children's

lives. But the fact is without your help, we can't keep those workers here. So we need you and we need you right now. Your gift right now is the difference between someone who is rescued, someone who is prevented from being trafficked, or someone who is stepping off the cliff of no return.
