4/29/24 Week 18: Spring Mission Feeding Randy Robison and Tammy Trent Andrew Farley

In the studio

RANDY: Welcome to *LIFE Today*! I'm Randy Robison. That's Tammy over there. And we're excited because Tammy, I love the online thing I get to do. I get to go into depth and have long conversations with a lot of different people.

And when I had Andrew Farley on, I was like we need to share him with our broadcast audience! Because he's got a book called *101 Bible Questions*. We're not going to get to all of them today, just warn you upfront, but I think you're going to hear something that will make you think, maybe put your mind at ease about some things, and maybe surprise you.

So Andrew, welcome to LIFE Today.

ANDREW: Thank you for having me. Great to be here.

RANDY: So I've watched you online for a while. And of course, we had a conversation online. I think, Tammy, you've just been introduced to him a little bit.

TAMMY: Totally, I did not know about Pastor Andrew.

RANDY: Some things surprised you?

TAMMY: Totally surprised me. I was sitting at home watching YouTube stuff, wanting to get to know Pastor Andrew. I'm like I like this! I was taking tons of notes. I'm like I did not know that. A girl raised in church my whole life and I'm like, this is new to me, and actually sort of freeing. Is it right, though? Am I right to question this, something I've known my whole life? And then Pastor Andrew would give a scripture. How do we know when it is the Word of God and when it is maybe a little altered?

ANDREW: For me, it is like the promise, it has to be real. The truth will set you free. So that means that a bunch of errors would put you in bondage and freak you out and confuse you. I think sometimes the easiest information to pass on to other people is the same thing that we heard growing up. So we just perpetuate this sort of lifeless religiosity.

What we're doing with the grace message is we're coming in saying, hey, let's rethink the finished work of Christ. This gospel is way better than you could ever imagine.

RANDY: Okay, you said something there that a lot of people, their red flags went up when you said "the grace message." Define that for us because I know—and you're not saying, but tell us what you are saying.

ANDREW: Well, first the grace message is the name of our ministry so I use that term to talk about the gospel, the gospel of grace, salvation by grace, growing by grace. As Paul said, just as you started, continue in Christ in the same way. So we can never have too much grace because the Bible says in Romans that sin will not master you because you're under grace. So let's embrace that grace. Let's not limit it. Grace is our victory over sin.

RANDY: Here's how people hear that. I know you know this, this is how people hear that. Oh! I don't have to worry about sinning because I've got grace. Why is that just way off?

ANDREW: Because grace is a lot bigger than forgiveness. Grace is a lot bigger than

mercy. By God's grace, you've got a new heart. By God's grace, you've got a new nature. You're put in a oneness in Christ. You're united with him. Titus two says the grace of God teaches us to live an upright life. And that's what we're talking about.

TAMMY: So I want to talk about salvation. So for me, it is the basic understanding of salvation. But let's talk about that. What is salvation? But beyond that, so many people fear that they could lose salvation. Can you? When you get it, is it possible to lose it? There are definitely arguments around tables about salvation.

ANDREW: If we're not careful, we end up with a theology that you're forgiven of all your sins until you sin. So we're putting a condition on someone who has given us unconditional love. As far as what salvation is, I think again, the average definition is you get your sins forgiven and you go to heaven. What we're saying is no, it's bigger than that. You get your sins forgiven, you're going to heaven, but also, there's been a heart surgery, there's been a D.N.A. swap. Out with the old, in with the new.

So suddenly, like the desire, the core desire where you were addicted to sin, that is gone and you're now allergic to sin. Now coming over here, I was preparing to eat lunch with you guys and they gave me a sandwich. I had to be careful that it didn't have a certain dressing because I'm allergic to eggs. Well, the Bible is saying it is very much like that spiritually. That believers are allergic to sin and addicted to Jesus now.

So as far as not being able to lose your salvation, I mean to me at this point, it is a nobrainer. Because I look at the promises of God and I've got to decide is God a liar? Because he says, "I'll never leave you, I'll never forsake you, nobody can snatch you out of my hand. Even when you are faithless, I remain faithful. Nothing separates you from the love of Christ." And secondly, I would say regarding our forgiveness, what kind of forgiveness do we have? Partial forgiveness or total? Because Jesus said, "It is finished." And he's taken away our sins as far as the east is from the west. He keeps no record of our wrongs. And lastly, Jesus called it "everlasting life." If it is "everlasting" then it lasts forever. So if I picked you up off the Titanic and rescued you in a lifeboat, took you halfway back to New York City but dumped you in the Atlantic, that wouldn't be salvation. And unfortunately, that's the view many people have of our life in Christ. When God has promised us ten ways throughout the scriptures, it is blasted at us in the New Testament, "I'll never leave you."

RANDY: I think it is easy to think you can earn your salvation if you think you can unearn your salvation. I can't earn mine so I don't think I can unearn it. But there's this problem. There's this problem of sin. I still sin. Do I not? I do.

TAMMY: He does. He does!

RANDY: Ask my wife. Right? How does that work?

ANDREW: Well, I think you're wise to bring up the simple fact that we didn't do anything to get our salvation. We didn't earn it, or achieve it, so therefore we don't sustain it or maintain it. If we get off on that road then it is like how do I know I'm saved? I think we have to say, all right, yes, I sin. I struggle every day; that's a reality. But I was never saved by my sinless perfection. It was never about me and my roller coaster experience. My performance is going to go up and down and all around but Jesus is my constant.

The bottom line is some people say God will never leave you but what if you wake up some day and leave him? I think that it ignores our identity in Christ because look at what God did. He took the person who wanted to abandon Jesus, and he took that person to the cross with him. Crucified with Christ. Buried with Christ. Now you're a new creation, the new self. And the new self will never stop believing and never stop loving Jesus.

One of my favorite verses in the Bible is Ephesians 6:24. It says that we have an undying love for Christ. It is imperishable. It will never fade. And wow! When you think about that, God has taken care of our dedication and commitment. All of those issues that we're

worried about. What if I abandoned him? He says, no. I'll never abandon you and I've caused you to love me forever.

RANDY: So are we prodigal sons when we live in sin? Are we still a son who has just walked away from God? In a sense, we're still sons but we're living in the slop? Is that what sin is for the Christian?

ANDREW: Here's the crazy thing. We're never ever in sin spiritually ever again. We're always in Christ. But look at what we're doing. We're doing exactly what you said. We're committing sins as a child of God. We're not dead in our sins, we're alive in Christ but we're not acting like it.

I grew up thinking when the Holy Spirit is bringing up issues in my life, he's going to beat me up about them, shame me, and guilt me. I would wait for the hammer to drop. Now, I'm realizing wait! No, the New Testament is the voice of the Holy Spirit, and he's saying you are a child of light. Walk in a manner that is worthy of your beautiful calling. You're holy, you're righteous, you're blameless.

So God is never tearing us down. He is always building us up in Jesus. He is never shaming us. He's always using our identity to inspire us. His spirit bears witness with ours that we are children of God. Therefore, walk in a way that fits who you are.

TAMMY: Whoo! That already just lifts me so much. Because I think so many people feel the heaviness of—even walking into church, you messed up again. You can't measure up. You are disqualified. You will never be enough. I think we walk out and we live with this, this week I wasn't good. I wasn't a good Christian, I sinned. I yelled at my kids—whatever, whatever! There's always something. We're always looking at this rather than everything you just said, Pastor, that gave me a fight inside. Fight for this! Believe this! Listen to this in your life.

So for me, it's like I wanted to instantly say if you're going to to a church where you're

hearing the other then find another church where they're lifting you. But I know so many of us, we're taught a certain thing and it is just really hard to get beyond that. Even when I think about—so we talked about salvation. Think about forgiveness; talked a little bit about that. I feel like I've got to run to Jesus, truthfully, and probably always will, it is my personality when I mess up. I'm like I'm so sorry. And you talked about that. I think I was listening to that in one of our podcasts or maybe reading in your book about forgiveness. Can we talk about that a little bit?

ANDREW: First of all, I think you're right. The healthy attitude, any time we sin is I'm sorry. I regret it. I have this remorse. Remember, I've got this beautiful new heart that is addicted to Jesus and I'm allergic to sin. So there is that natural reaction.

But also, I've got to factor in what Jesus did for me. We call it the finished work of Christ because we don't have to finish it. He did it all. And so 2,000 years ago, he looks down the timeline of your sins and he says I remember them no more—past, present, and future. Christians are not being forgiven progressively, we are forgiven people. The average Christian seems to think that we need to get forgiven sin by sin, little by little, almost like paying off your car in installments, paying off your mortgage, and payments.

We've got this unusual view it is an apology-based forgiveness, instead of a blood-based forgiveness. So Jesus shed his blood once. It worked the first time. No repeat is needed. Therefore, we are totally forgiven people forever.

RANDY: What about judgment? I mean judgment is coming, right? We're going to give an account of everything we've said or done.

ANDREW: Yeah! So the only answer to that is he who believes in me is not judged. He who does not believe in me stands judged already.

RANDY: Wait! That's in the Bible? [Laughing] Who knew? That's good news!

ANDREW: So you're right. Look. There are a lot of things in the Bible belt that aren't in the Bible. We've got to remember that. Because we start filling our heads with religious ideas. Oh, my goodness! I'm going to be in line, popcorn in hand, ready to watch my blockbuster film of every sin I've ever committed. And the truth is, God has destroyed that reel. He remembers them no more.

So we've got to watch the double talk. Because we're saying, I'm totally forgiven, I'm totally—except when the judgment comes. I'm cleansed. God remembers them no more. But later on, he will remember them. So we've got a double talk in our belief system, and sometimes, we're not even aware of it.

So in this book, *101 Bible Questions*, I'm helping people strip away the double talk. We're going to highlight Jesus like never before. We're going to say what did he do for me? And what did he do to me? And how radical and how incredible his love is.

TAMMY: That is so good. That's what I love so much about your teaching. Seriously, it was like you said, it is not rocket science. There is no worm in the apple, which I loved, I'm going to use that and I did just now. But you're just like it is so simple. I think sometimes we complicate it so much and then we're taught like you said a certain way, now I'm going to try to teach my other friends this. I get it a little bit backward.

But one thing I just wanted to say that meant so much to me because I know I've often even said, I want to get closer to God. Let's get closer to God at this conference. Let's grow closer! And you had said something that was like a light bulb went off. You're like I'm going to say, "Tammy, you are close to Jesus. But what your prayers need to be is like give me a greater understanding. Let me invest in the understanding of God." That changed a little something in my life at that moment. Can you explain that?

ANDREW: Yeah! We're always doing this. Like I'm 12 years old and the worship leader's on stage and he's got 42 holes in his jeans and the smoke is rolling out and the music is blaring. And he looks up and he says, "God, come down into this place. Fall

fresh. Come visit us." And we're so used to a visitation mentality. Like God is going to come near and go away. Then come near again and go away.

We've got to realize we're the building. I mean we're the church. We're a walking church with Christ in us. And our closeness with God is free. And you're right, we don't always feel it. We don't always think it. And so there is a renewing of the mind. But let's do a one-foot journey from head to heart. Let's come down here and say, how close am I even when I don't remember, how close am I? Even when I don't feel it, how close am I? Thank you, Lord, that I'm one with you.

RANDY: See that's where I kind of wanted to ask that. Because it can easily sound like oh! We don't have to do anything. God's done it all. In certain areas, we can't do it so he has. But we do have a responsibility to renew our minds daily, to abide in him. What would a healthy Christian life look like on our part? What would we be doing?

ANDREW: So right before this program we were all talking about great restaurants. We were talking about great food and great restaurants. See when you find a great restaurant and they're serving great food, it is natural to want to go back there and eat more, and also tell people about it because it is delicious, it is amazing. It is no different with the good Word of God. It is good food.

So when you look at who you are and that new heart you've got, do you want to be stuck in that same old nasty way of living life or do you want the software updates? I've got new heart ware. It is shiny and brand-new from the factory, but I'm getting software updates. You know what that's like. There's that choice on your computer. You can hit either the X and click out of it and say forget it or remind me tomorrow, Lord. Or you can say yes, I accept the new software updates. So that's the renewing of the mind.

So, man, it is healthy and so good to fill your mind with new thoughts and new perspectives. The Holy Spirit is doing that. God's Word is doing that in you. Do you want to eat out of the dumpster and get sick? Or do you want to eat at that brand-new

restaurant that is killer and is so amazing and so delicious?

RANDY: Jesus describes being with him as a banquet but somehow in our churches we make it a beating. I'd just like to get back to the banquet.

ANDREW: Yeah! So Jesus is saying something pretty profound. He says when you have the real thing it is going to be easy and light, and you'll find rest for your soul. We were just studying Ephesians at the Grace Church. And in Ephesians says, "Fathers, don't provoke your kids to anger but instead bring them up in the instruction of the Lord."

What that shows me is that the instruction of the Lord doesn't make us angry or embittered. But he is training us for a better future.

RANDY: Okay. We've answered four questions. There are another 97 in this book. I'll tell you what, I'd love to send this book to you if you'll support an outreach. Some people are hungry and thirsty and in great need right now. Someone who needs a touch from God. You can be that touch.

Will you watch this and just pause and say a prayer, Lord, what would you have me do? If he moves on you, obey. And if you want to request Andrew's book, we'll send that to you. But watch this opportunity to be God's answer to someone else's prayer.

ISAK: So Tammy, we're coming into this village. I've actually never been to this village before. Our advance team has been here.

>> Crisis in Ethiopia. Drought and conflict put millions in need.

ISAK: We've heard that there's over 190,000 people in this area that are chronically food

insecure. There's been six years of drought here.

>> Ethiopia starvation. Fear of famine grows.

ISAK: So families have told us they've totally run out of food. They've even eaten the seed that they had. So even if rain was to come sufficient to be able to farm, there is no way they could even plant because they've eaten their seed to try to survive.

This really is a crisis situation. It is a case of us having to respond immediately with emergency food, bringing it in, and being able to save lives, particularly of young children. It is the little children like this that are the ones that are the most vulnerable.

TAMMY: Isak, I think about that little guy right now and what his life might be like every day. We're talking about these kids starving to death because they don't have food. It rips me up because some of these things I have not heard, and I know our viewers might not have even heard some of these stories, some of the statistics, and truly, the reality of life and death.

I don't know where you're at in life today, I don't know what your circumstance might be today as you're watching this, but I can almost bet you that it might be just a little bit better than the lives of these precious people here in this village right now.

If you are in a position to give to this outreach I would respond. If God is laying it on your heart, then I would respond and do whatever you can do. I know that when we come together as God's family, I totally believe, and those aren't just words, but I believe when we come together, we can make an enormous impact. And I want to make an impact in the lives of every one of these children. Let's do it today.

TAMMY: I was just in Ethiopia. That footage is very raw, and it is very recent. The impression that those people left on my life and my heart is eternal. The baby that you saw was in a malnutrition clinic, and she was dying. I think that was the hardest day of the entire trip for me. They're all shockingly hard and heartbreaking. But to sit and stand over a baby that was fighting for her life, dying before my eyes, and realizing that it was about food. The fact that she lacked food. Her family lacked food. These children were all lacking food.

Randy, it was devastating for me. I had to walk out of that room. I sobbed and sobbed because I didn't want them to have to live like that. I kept asking God, what can I do? What can I do, God, today because they might not have tomorrow?

RANDY: I know. I have been in a clinic in Angola, actually where I prayed for a little girl. I believe—I know God can heal miraculously but she died that night and that's a hard thing. And you ask, what do we do? We do what we can do. Poverty is not a problem that is going to go away overnight. It is a generational thing. That's why we feed 350,000 children every day already.

We only do that through the support of viewers just like you. So those of you of that given, thank you. You have saved so many lives. But when we look, we see the situation in Ethiopia right now, and I won't explain it all right now but I was accidentally in Ethiopia last year. I wasn't supposed to be there and got diverted there. And God touched my heart and said, there is something special here. I didn't understand it. We had no plans to go there at the time. But then Isak went in.

Look, we've got teams on the ground. We have people ready to serve—literally to serve. We just need your support. And this is what it looks like. \$30 will help feed three children for the next three months. Now if you do the math on that, you go, that is remarkably little. Well, it is because we have many things in place. We just need to sort of cross the finish line.
