JAMES: It is an honor to spend this time with you. This is Betty; this is my wife who I will soon be married to for 61 years. I know she doesn't even look that old. We have Tammy Trent with us today. I'm anxious to talk to Tammy. Tammy is really, without speaking beyond the absolute truth, she is family. She's helping us get God's arms around a broken world.

Let me just say this to you. Today, yes, God wants you to help put his arms around the overlooked. But please hear this, he wants to put his arms around you. He wants to hold you up real close to let you know how important you are to him and what you mean to him. He also wants you to know how freely and effectively you can flow his love and his peace and his joy—beyond even imagination.

Father, help everyone listening to hear your voice that this can happen; can flow like a river of life through everyone watching. Heal every broken heart. Hold them in your arms so they can hold others; in Jesus' name.

So glad you joined us. Tammy, I've got another piece of footage of you on the mission field. We're talking water here in a little while. I don't know anybody that talks about anything she sees anywhere in this world that needs a touch of God that doesn't seem to recognize it more clearly and express the need more clearly. And frankly, Betty, inspires people who are watching to want to do something about it which they can.

BETTY: Absolutely! And Tammy, as I've watched you on the mission field, it just brings back

such sweet, sweet memories. Yes, it is a hard trip, it is a long trip, but when you get over there the rewards are so great; to know that we're going to make a difference. We're going to offer them the water of life. And make that difference for that mother that so loves her children.

So thank you for going on our behalf to share and to love these precious little children.

TAMMY: It is my complete honor. You guys, both of you, you set the tone. You have been great leaders in this area. So when I have ever watched back at some of your early trips, I'm like that's how you do it. You love people well. You have taught us all so well at this ministry how to go wherever God calls, follow that lead, and then respond with all of your heart in the way that Jesus would respond in the situation.

And then come back and give people a chance to do something about it. We're all in a place I believe where we can do something.

And so what a privilege and an honor! For me, I get to get on a plane and fly across the world and do something about it. And then to come back and talk about it, what a privilege to be with you today.

JAMES: You know, I want to let our viewers see Jesus in you, in one of those settings. And you may—you probably remember it but you've gone a lot—to a lot of places. But this was touching to me. And I think you'll want to see it. So let's look in on Tammy as she looks in on what God sees that too often goes unnoticed.

Tammy: I'm here in Burundi, Africa walking along this little stream here. This water is filthy. You can look at it and see it is so dirty. Now imagine that being your only source of water. Imagine this being your baby. Imagine him drinking this water every single day.

I don't even know if I would call this water. It is filthy, it is so dirty. It is filled with

contamination. I know that he is in the condition he is in because he has been drinking this water. Do you know that statistics say that they are at most risk between the ages of one to five? So this little guy, right now, I can tell you is not doing well. I fear that if he continues to drink this water, he probably won't make it.

When you witness a child drinking water like this around the world, it's not a question of, I think they'll be okay. I think they're quenching their thirst. It's really a matter of whether or not they're going to live or die.

And that is just too much of a burden that he should never have to carry.

And I know that I want to live a life that produces life. I want to make decisions that are life-giving.

I don't want him to ever have to drink this water again, or his children.

JAMES: I wish I could pick up a perfectly clean, clear glass and let you see some clean water. "You give a cup of water in my name," Jesus said, "you won't lose your reward." And his reward is his reward, his blessings.

Tammy, you've been going now to the mission field as many times as anyone other than Betty, which no one has matched us except the missionaries. And you've carried with you not just your typical, let's say tenderhearted woman's heart and sensitivity, but you've carried, without being able to hide it, the very heart and love of God. You could see it right there. That little boy is precious. And we can actually give him not only a clean cup of water but we could give him—we, we could give him a well of water that's there for years every day all day. And people can come from far and wide that never had clean water.

What goes on inside of you now when you look back and think about all the places you've been,

you think about all the needs you've seen, but you also think about all the places you've gone back to and you've seen the miracle that these viewers performed on all those people, a miracle of life. What's going on inside of you?

TAMMY: Watching that with you guys, I remember that little guy for one. It's hard not to get emotional watching that again because it puts me right back in that same place, in that same moment with him wondering what he is doing today, how is he doing today. I could help give him some clean water even that day. But I don't just want to give them a cup, I want to give them many cups. Many cups! I want to help build their future and give them a life that God intended them to have.

So for me, when I'm in a place like that, I believe the first step, every child should have access to clean water around the world. What an awful thing to think that that little guy and many children don't have that. So I just thought in that moment what could I do? How could I tell somebody else about this need?

And I think, James, for me, I'm always prayerful and intentional about wanting to capture the heart of these families, this village, and these children. And I want people to be able to see what I feel, and I want them to feel what I feel. It is genuine, it is real, and the need is real. So my hope is to come back here with you guys and have the chance just like you've done for years to tell people about such a real need. And then to be able to do something about it, to go in there, to go back to those places and see that we've drilled a well. There're many times I've just stood there and I've celebrated and I've clapped my hands and I've rejoiced and said yes! I've helped them pump those wells myself.

It's so exciting to be there, to see that there is a solution. We just don't talk about the problem, we talk about that there is a solution. And together, we have been able to put in over 350 wells. Even this year, that's our goal, in 20 nations. It's exciting to me. My hope is that we do way, way beyond that.

BETTY: You know, Tammy, I know the many trips that we've made over there to the mission

field, every time is different. You think, oh, I can do this. I'm used to this. I know what to do now. But we're so overwhelmed when we get there because God puts a freshness in our hearts for loving those people. Everyone we see is unique and different, and the situation is so heartbreaking.

But yet, to know that we're going to be able to come back and talk to you and let you know that you can feel that too, you can know that. And know that every time you see a little child like we just saw with Tammy, they need our help. They need to know that somebody cares about them. That mother needs to know that somebody notices her child's needs. Thank you for that.

JAMES: And in every place where you see that, God touches your heart to touch their heart with a healing touch, with a touch of life. Remember this, it's not just giving them a chance at life right now, but we're going to show them life. Because these missionaries and their families have moved their lives right in there in the midst of the suffering and the need, without the ability to meet the need.

And that's why when people like Betty and me came, and we were so moved we said, "We want to move in with you."

They said, "Please, don't move in with us. Go back and get us some help so we can stay here and not be empty-handed; so we can give them food and water and help and hope."

Do you know God sent us back to lead thousands of people in crusades to touch millions of people all over the world who never knew anyone in the universe or on this planet would ever notice them? And God did. But he uses noticers who notice. And then, we extend not merely our hands but his hands.

Tammy, you have seen what their love can do. Can you just say to them that if they would give one gift for a well of \$4800, or could they give a well because some do or part of a well? Let them know the joy and the effect it will have. Would you just tell them that? Because you've seen the need. Now she wants to talk to you and tell you what you can do.

TAMMY: There is so much joy around it. You could see it. We have so much footage that we could show you of how these villages have come from nothing to—like the struggle, trying to survive every day, trying to find a way to save their children and their families. They're doing everything they can but they're truly so very limited.

And then when we come in there, we set that rig up. We're all standing around there and they're digging deeper and deeper because the water is under their feet. They just can't get to it. They need our help. They will dig with shovels but they can't get as deep as they need to.

So we're standing around and they're going deeper and deeper with the machines until water starts springing up—which is life! And now life is happening in that village. These people are going to begin to thrive! There is no doubt about it. We see it firsthand. And with the thriving comes the joy of life. They're being educated in school. They want to go to school. They've got the water. Their families are working again. There are so many more things they can do because of what that well has brought to that village. There's truly so much joy around it.

And probably also, one of my greatest privileges is walking in and praying for these families. And telling them that yes, pain is real but so is hope! And we're not going to let you sit in this. We will find a way. We will fight for every dollar we can. We will all pull it together and we'll come back.

I feel like every time we go someplace, like you want to be careful not to promise, but I have a vision, I have a dream, and I know I'm coming back. I'm going to find a way to be back here. So when we get to go back and see the joy, see the thriving, all in the name of Jesus, we pray with these families and tell them that God loves them and sees them, and he's not going to leave them without. I know it feels like that but he is making a way because he's called all of us to step into the gap and stand in here and help these people. What a privilege to help people.

JAMES: I really think it is important in light of what you said when they need water so much that they dig and dig and they may find it. And if they do find it, they'll create what they call a

borehole. One of the reasons, Tammy, that we know there is water in their area is they found it. But they couldn't get to the place where they could get to a source that was basically protected in any way, and they didn't have the ability to steel-case it or enclose it.

So the water itself, although giving them some fresh water, it gave them contaminated water. Because in a very short period of time, with the animals and everything passing by and all the people putting all the instruments down to draw the water, it just got filthy. And it was as diseased as any of the other water.

But we know the water is there. So when we bring the drilling rigs in that you, people like you paid for, you had to pay tens of thousands of dollars to get those rigs and keep them going. Until we drilled thousands and thousands, 8,000 wells, 350 this year right now if you'll help with one. Could you do one or part of one? Could you give \$48 for ten people to have water?

See, there is somebody right now that you can put God's arms around. So we know the water is there. We're going to drill it, we're going to encase it, we're going to give them a manual pump that even a grade school child can function and make it work.

So please, please right now, would you do what God is impressing you to do? I want you to listen to someone else that I do respect. I think they will inspire you to do what you've been inspired by the love of God through others to do yourself. Watch closely.

On the mission field

RANDY: I had the privilege of being a part of *LIFE*'s mission outreaches. God, just touch this child.

Each journey is life-changing as we witness desperate need and understand our ability to intervene. Our recent trip to Burundi was no exception as I saw just how bad the water conditions are for thousands of people in this area. I can't help but notice that they're working so hard to get water that actually—it could be kill them.

>> Yeah, but they have no other choice. They have no other wells or any water sources here that they can drink from. This is the only thing they have.

RANDY: It is tempting to think conditions can't get any worse. But when I meet another mother who has lost a child because of contaminated water, my heart breaks. And as we travel to different villages, the names and faces change but the struggle is the same.

Geraldine is a mother here in this village in Burundi. She comes down here to get water for her family like all the other villagers because it is the only place they can get it. But it is not good. After Geraldine collected her water, we accompanied her to her home where she told us about her two-year-old daughter Sandrine who died from a waterborne disease.

>> She was a beautiful girl and she was growing and helping me here. Then she got really sick with bloody diarrhea and when we got her to the hospital, she died two days later.

RANDY: I am a father. I have four children. I'm so sorry that you lost your daughter.

Lord, we pray for your divine protection for this family, for all these children. And Lord, we pray you would move on the hearts—

You can be that light by making it possible to drill a water well in Geraldine's village, and many more like hers. Every new well provides clean drinking water for a lifetime which helps prevent death and disease for families like this. When you give life to an entire village you become the answer to their prayers.

JAMES: Boy, that is no exaggeration. Do you realize that Randy was still a teenager, Betty,

when we started feeding the hungry and then began to drill water? Now he's got four grown children, married, and got his first little grandson.

But he's seen the power of love. He has seen what it is to reach out and touch someone that never knew they were even noticed. Do you realize that when you see what that mother sees, when you feel what they feel, and you have the hope, you have the miracle, you have the answered prayer? You are the miracle they long for. You are the answered prayer they've been praying for.

If you would right now make a gift, a gift of life to help us drill a well in their area, it would be an indescribable miracle. Now think about what I'm saying, please, think very seriously.
