Studio Discussion:

RANDY: Welcome to *LIFE Today*. I'm Randy Robison. I'm just loving being here today

because John Bevere is with me. By the way, we talked a lot about *The Awe of God*. This is a

book that's blessed so many people. So many of you have seen it. It is available wherever you get

books. But if you missed the other program, any of the programs, go to LifeToday.org because

today we are talking about Everyday Courage, and this is a new devotional. You'll want to get it

too. But I love the practicality of this. I love putting a lot of the ideas, the truth that John brings

into action because this is how we live. Welcome back!

JOHN: It's so good to be back. I love being with you.

RANDY: Is that a fair setup of *Everyday Courage*?

JOHN: It sure is. Everyday Courage, what happened is the publisher we've seen, The Awe of

God has been selling like crazy. Still is after almost two years. We have such a burden to put

courage back into believer's hearts. With all the cancel culture, with all the hate speech, with

everything that's going on, we have to put courage back into the hearts of the people.

You know what's really interesting to me? And this is really what caught my attention, and this

is why we call it Everyday Courage. God said to Joshua seven times; now he either said it

through Moses or he said it through the elders of Israel, once through the elders or he said it

directly, "Be strong and of good courage." One day I'm praying. I'm praying and the Holy Spirit

asked me, "Son, what's the opposite of courage?" I said -- excuse me, I said, "Fear." He said,

"Put a dis- in front of it." I went, "Discourage!"

Randy, all of the sudden I realized, discourage was something I tolerated because I didn't see it

as an archenemy. Oh, I'm just feeling a little discouraged today. Am I right?

RANDY: Yeah!

JOHN: He said, "Son, it's the opposite of courage. I told Joshua seven times to be strong and of

good courage. Which means what? You're going to have a lot of opportunity to be

discouraged." I went, oh, my gosh! And from that day forward I began to treat discouragement as

an archenemy.

RANDY: So, there is a story, you've heard it. The Israelites delivered from slavery and God

had a Promised Land for them. So, you have their deliverance, and you've got their destiny, and

you've got this desert in-between. And you know, one of the biggest reasons they didn't get there

was because --

JOHN: Discouragement was communicated by ten leaders.

RANDY: That's it.

JOHN: It is something that is contagious. It is more contagious than COVID. It is more contagious than anything. I had a man actually say to me really early on in ministry. He said, "John, would you rather speak to three million people or ten leaders?" I said, "Three million people!" He said, "Wrong answer." He said, "Ten leaders caused three million people to never enter their destiny." I went, "Oh, my gosh!" And I realized how important, first of all, leadership is. Secondly, I realized how deadly discouragement is. How it can be so easily transmitted.

I find -- and I'm going to say something that may really upset some people, and I hope you're okay with what I say. If I find a negative person, a person who lives in discouragement, I've found a person whose mind is not renewed. If your mind is renewed -- because we're commanded to present our body a living sacrifice and be renewed in the spirit of our mind, correct? If we're renewed with the Word of God, you will always have a positive outlook no matter what you're facing. If you look at the first -- the first person who is listed that will be outside of the glorious city of God that will actually be punished, it is the cowards. Cowards are people who have lost courage. Cowards are people that have allowed discouragement to cause them to lose their courage.

So, it is not something to be taken lightly. That's why I say I started realizing it was an archenemy. Because when I look at that in the book of Revelation, and go check me out. Everybody at home, just get your Bible, and it is right around chapter 20, 21, right in there. It says, these are the people that will be outside -- they won't see God, they'll be outside of God. It is the cowardly.

RANDY: Again, that reflects the Israelites. Here's a hard question though because let's just put ourselves there. Twelve people sent in. Two came back; they're saying one thing, ten are saying

another thing. I mean, we would say, well, there is wisdom in counsel. I'm going to go with the ten and not the two.

How do we know the difference between who we should listen to, especially when we're outnumbered by supposedly godly people?

JOHN: Let's think about the Apostle Paul. He's meeting with leaders that he raised up in the church and they meet at Miletus. He says to them, by the Spirit of God, "This is the last time you'll see me until heaven."

Now he knows this, by the Spirit of God. Now think about it, he can't text them. He can't call them on the iPhone. He can't even email them. If he writes a letter it is going to take three or four months. What are you going to say to these guys that you raised up who are leaders? He said, "Now, brothers, I commend you to God." Of course, who is God? God the Holy Spirit. He is the person of the godhead that's here on earth. The Father and the Son are on their throne. "I commend you to God and to the word of His grace which is able to build you up and give you your inheritance."

I find the person to listen to is the person that closely adheres to the Word of God. All those people knew that God told them over and over again, "I am bringing you out of Egypt to bring you into a good land, a land flowing with milk and honey. I didn't send those spies over there to see if you could take the land."

It wasn't even God's idea. It was Moses' -- it was the people's idea. God says, "Go ahead. Go on over there and find out how wonderful this land is." And the land was so wonderful it took two

men to carry a bushel of grapes. Two men! That's how abundantly fruitful this land was. And this is what God has been telling them the whole time, "I'm giving you a land of milk and honey." They were only supposed to be in that desert for one year. It was one year after coming out of Egypt they sent those guys in.

I look at this and here's ten guys with discouragement that literally pass it on to all three million people. And two guys with courage couldn't overcome that discouragement because it is so deadly. And so, I would say to stay safe, look at the Word of God. I look at the Christians in Berea, they were far wiser because they searched the scriptures to even see if the great Apostle Paul, what he was saying was true.

So, the Word of God will produce courage in you. The Word of God will keep your ear open to the people who are speaking the truth.

RANDY: That's so solid. Thank you. I love that.

Okay. Courage. There are a lot of different areas you talk about in *Everyday Courage*. We just talked a little bit about courage in the unknown because they didn't know -- they knew they had a fight but that's why they sent out the spies to figure out what is going on over there. That's a big one, I think, for a lot of people, not knowing -- not knowing one, if it is God's will, not knowing if it is going to succeed, if people are going to like me, you know, how do you --

JOHN: Let me address that one. Number one, is it God's will? The Bible says, "Don't be foolish but understand the will of the Lord," in the book of Ephesians. So, what are we as believers supposed to do? We are supposed to stay quiet before the Lord in prayer, listening,

until we know the will of the Lord.

Also, I find people that lose heart, that become discouraged aren't in the Word of God every day. If all four sons are sitting here and you said, "What's the thing you remember most about your dad?" They would say, "When we woke up at 5:30 in the morning, we came down, and we saw our dad reading the Bible in his office." Because I have seen too many pastors fall away. I have seen too many of them look at me and say, "I'm tired."

I'm 65 years old, Randy, I feel like I've got enough energy to take a mountain. I do! I really do. I was in four cities in 48 hours preaching before I came here to you. I feel like I've got the energy of a 30-year-old. Okay. Why is that? The Word of God builds you up and gives you your inheritance. I understand the importance.

When I look at pastors and they say I'm about to turn my church over and I'm 50-some years old. I'm like what? What's the real reason? Tell me the reason. "I'm tired, John. I'm tired." I'll ask them, "Are you praying? Are you spending time every day reading your Bible?" You know what the answer is? "No."

Now, they read the Bible to prepare for their Sunday message but I'm like, wait a minute. People ask me, they say which one do you like more? Do you like going out? Because I have tennis courts right by our house and I go out there when it is dark out and I pray. Then I come in the house and read the Bible. They say, which one do you enjoy the most? I have to say, if I have to be really honest, it is when I'm reading the Bible. Because I feel like when I'm praying out in those tennis courts I'm talking to God. When I'm reading the Bible, he is talking to me.

So, I read the scripture before, my boys will all say this, I wouldn't even have to prompt them.

They would say, "What do you do when you read your Bible?" Every one of them will look at

you and go, "We ask the Holy Spirit to teach us." Because the Holy Spirit is our teacher. The

teacher wants permission to be able to open up the scripture and bring it alive to you. That's

what I do. I've been reading the Bible for 45 years and I never get tired of it. It is my favorite

book. But I always pray, "Holy Spirit, please open my eyes and teach me as I read." And he

shows me fresh new things every time I read.

I'm telling you, it produces courage in you. Courage isn't just something you can mentally just

work up. I believe it is a spiritual force.

RANDY: Would you say that sometimes we don't have courage in the face of the unknown and

some other areas because we haven't taken the time to hear from God?

JOHN: I would say yes.

RANDY: And then it is not courage, it is foolishness?

JOHN: I wouldn't go that far but I think a lot of times it is. I don't want to say every time it is

foolishness but a lot of times it can end up easily being foolish.

RANDY: Another thing you say which is to obey God even when it doesn't make sense.

JOHN: Okay. So, does it make sense to forgive somebody who has really hurt your family?

Does it make sense to bless somebody who gossiped about you, and you lost your dream job?

But you see, the fear of the Lord means that I will tremble at his word. Which means I'll obey God's Word even if I don't understand it, even if I don't see a benefit, even if it hurts. See, Jesus obeyed the Father to the point of death. He feared the Lord.

Peter says, "As Christ suffered for us in the flesh, I'm going to suffer with the same mind." What does that mean? Does that mean we go out and look for suffering? Never! A religious person who serves a foreign god who really isn't even a god will try to do that. But the Christian says, I live in a fallen world. I live in a world who is anti-God; that the world, he is the prince of the power of the air. So, in obeying God, I'm going to suffer persecution, I'm going to suffer hardship, I'm going to suffer affliction but if you're armed for it, you're not in shock, bewilderment or amazement when you face it. Because the Word of God has armed you and prepared you. So, that's why I believe we should stay in prayer and stay in the Word of God.

Do you know what is interesting? This year, I sat with two pastors who have been in ministry. They've both been pastors for over 50 years and the passion they have is through the roof. I asked them, "What is your secret?" The one in particular I'm thinking about, who has started over 500 churches all over the world, looked at me and said, "It is my 4:00 a.m. prayer time, John." He didn't even bat an eye. He said, "It is because I get up and I seek God. I seek him passionately." Because that man understands, he is in a war, the devil wants to take him out, he oversees 500 churches all over the globe and he's a target.

RANDY: So, if you want to cultivate courage, you say arm yourself in adversity.

JOHN: Arm yourself. Let me give you an example of someone who is armed and someone who

is not. A pilot. What do they do? They send them into simulators, and they throw every

catastrophe at them that they can think of. Right? Passengers are not armed. When the

catastrophe hits, they're all screaming. Have you ever been on a plane before when it's been in

trouble?

RANDY: Coming back from Colorado Springs! Yes! My worst flight ever. Yeah, I hate it.

JOHN: The pilots go into control. They start saying, "Pull up the flaps. Feather the engines."

Do whatever needs to be done because they've been armed. The passengers react. Pilots act.

RANDY: I sweat.

JOHN: Okay. So, what am I doing when I'm in the Word of God? I am in my flight simulator

and God is arming me. I'm seeing Joseph who is not even in a Bible study, he is not even in a

church, he doesn't have a home group, and yet -- his dream hasn't come to pass in ten years. And

here's a woman with a seductive spirit up to her eyeballs trying to get him to go to bed with her.

He's like, most people would be, what good is it serving God? God gave me a dream ten years

ago. It's ten years I've been a slave. My dad thinks I'm dead. I lost all my inheritance from my

father. I'm a slave for the rest of my life.

But he obeys God. Why? He had a fear of God. When you live through that with Joseph and the

Holy Spirit is teaching you from it, he is arming you so that when you face adversity you don't

react like the passengers, you act like the pilots.

RANDY: So, do you think that's why a lot of people are a little freaked out or discouraged

today? Is because they've not armed themselves with the word?

JOHN: I tell you why. They're spending more time on screens than they are in the Word of God.

I can walk up to any young person, especially, 30 years and under and say, "Okay, show me your

phone. Let's see how many hours you were on the screens last week. Do you read your Bible on

this screen?" "No, not really." "Okay. So, you're on your screen it looks like to me, 36 hours

last week. How much did you read the Bible last week?" I'm going to tell you, they'll drop their

head and they won't answer. And so, we wonder why do we have a church, and the western

church right now that's --

I look at Dietrich Bonhoeffer. He spoke up. During the Hitler regime, he spoke up. He stood

out. You look at these great men of God. Watchman Nee in China; he spoke up. They put him in

jail. They cut his tongue out. But yet, he kept preaching with his hands. A person who spends

time with God has a strength about them. And that strength is what it takes to overcome this very

corrupt world we're in.

Because Randy, I'll be really honest with you; 40 years ago when I got -- 45 years ago when I got

saved, if you were to tell me, we would be where we are at today in our society in the United

States I would have said, "There's no way. There's no way."

RANDY: That slippery slope argument, you're a little gray.

JOHN: It can't go that bad that fast.

RANDY: Right. And here we are.

JOHN: And here we are. I don't see how anybody can survive this onslaught of lawlessness. Because it says before the man of sin is revealed there is going to be a mystery of lawlessness that is going to be at work in our society. I don't see how anybody can survive this onslaught of lawlessness without being in the Word of God.

RANDY: So, what is that *Everyday Courage* look like just to the person who gets up and goes to work or takes care of the house? They're not the Bonhoeffers, they're not out there.

JOHN: First of all, go to bed 30 minutes earlier and get up before anybody else gets up in your house, or if you get up together, fine, and get yourself in the Word of God -- the first thing. That's why David said, "My voice you will hear in the morning." Because what David was saying is I don't want to face the day without you renewing me, you recalibrating me.

Very interesting thing. I was in prayer and God showed me how when we read scripture it recalibrates us. So, I thought, that's interesting. So, I found out, where do you do recalibration? I thought, gas detectors have to be recalibrated. I knew that just by my engineering background. So I went to a company, I can't remember the company, I can't remember if it was Phillips or whatever, Dow Chemical. And I went to their technicians page where the technicians actually use this page to calibrate their gas detectors. Because federal law says you have to have a gas detector in every room in a chemical factory. Because the gas detector says, hey, there is unhealthy amount of -- right? Get out! So, these technicians recalibrate them. So, go to the page and at the top of the page says, "We strongly recommend you recalibrate these gas detectors every day!" I went, oh, my gosh! And then it gave the reason why. It said, "Because the atmosphere will corrupt them easily."

Do you know how they recalibrate them? They bring them into a clean air room. They recalibrate and then they put them back out. So now, what do we do? Every morning, we go into the clean air room, the presence of God. The Word of God recalibrates me because the atmosphere of the world probably had a little effect on me yesterday, right? So, that's why I'm 41 years in ministry and still I'm not jaded, I'm not cynical, I don't plan to go there because I want to stay fresh. I want to stay on fire for Jesus. I don't want to lose the love I had for him at first.

RANDY: All right. Stay calibrated out there, people! You can do it with a little help from John in *Everyday Courage*: "50 devotions to build a bold faith." I don't know if that word *build* is there, how intentional it is? But that is it! You build it. What you're talking about is building it day by day.

We'd love to send that to you if you will help us as we build the faith of others by showing the love of Christ to people. There are some people right now that I've been told by some of them in the field, we prayed to God and then --

We want to be that answer to people's prayers. We want you to be a part of an exciting thing. Watch this and you'll see how.

Transition Roll-in:

ASHTON: On my first day here in Benguela, we decided to go and visit the Benguelan malnutrition clinic. Prior to this trip, I thought I was prepared to see these things. I've watched James and Betty on TV. I've been in their studio. I've seen the videos, I've heard the stories so I

can handle this.

But when I stepped in, there was a child on every single bed. They're skin and bones. Some of them have sores on their mouths. They've got that tint of orange hair that you often see in malnourished children. Some of them -- it was joyful to see because some of them were drinking that milk and eating that peanut butter mix that the team provided for them. You could tell that they were gaining weight.

But then there were others. There was this little girl named Maria. And just to lay eyes on her broke my heart. As I laid my hand on her leg, I remember how small it was. It was taking every bit of energy she had just to sit up. But this is the condition.

Coming here and meeting the moms, meeting the babies, holding their children, these aren't just stories, they're real people -- real children. It's completely different when you're here and you hold their hands. You ask them the questions and they share their sorrows with you, facing tragedy and suffering every single day.

The goal here is to give these people a lifeline so that they can build themselves up, they can have enough food. Their desire isn't for a handout but a hand up. We need your help.

Studio Appeal:

RANDY: I know those pictures are hard to look at. There are networks that won't let us air that. There are social media platforms that have removed some of our videos to show you how hard that is. But we need you to understand the reality out there.

When you get there and you see it and you really get it in your soul, it is an easy thing to want to help. That's why we want you to understand the need because you need to understand the power of your participation.

John, I know you've been over there. It changes when you're on the ground.

JOHN: Yeah. I think what really did it for me is when we were running out of food, and I saw the desperation in those kids. It happened and we had nothing to give them. We were way out in the middle of nowhere. These are human beings; these are real people.

RANDY: They're God's creation.

JOHN: I love what *Life Today* is doing.

RANDY: I appreciate your heart because I know it's genuine. There is a lot of good things in this world, there are a lot of good causes but I'm talking about a God cause here. Remember the poor. Remember the poor! Visit those who are in distress, those who are hungry. This is -- it is so simple.

Let me break it down for you on a practical level just so you know. Not all of you can go. You don't want to go. But you can't go, that's the thing. You can go in the name of Jesus because we don't go anywhere where we don't proclaim Jesus Christ. This is how we do it. This is how you participate: \$30 will basically feed three children for the next three months. How do you do that? Well, it is because we have people in place. We have the whole chain in place to get the food to the most desperate situations. And if they get to where they're self-sufficient, they're good, malnutrition isn't an issue, we go to another place where there is great need.

We're not going to outpace the need here, but we are only going to do as much as you enable us to do. Maybe you can give \$50 and feed five children for the next three months. \$100 will feed ten. Many of you can give \$1,000 to feed 100 children, maybe more!

By the way, this is the last week we'll be on the air with this outreach. But the need will continue and as many of you plan the end-of-the-year giving, this is a wonderful place. I pray that you will consider putting it right here because Mission Feeding works. Mission Feeding saves lives.
